Sermon Notes

Continuing on in Faith

2 Timothy 1:1-7

Transitions are difficult. Timothy's leader, his mentor was in prison, and it wasn't looking good - dissension from within, the challenge of False teachers, and the threat of persecution. The book of 2 Timothy is basically Paul preparing Timothy to take the mantle of Gospel ministry.

Life brings change, but God, His Faithfulness, and His purposes do not change! On the edge of a new beginning, it is wise and necessary to look back and see how we got here and consider what we need moving forward. You see, God has been at work, and He is still working. He has plans for me and you.

We can always walk into the future with great confidence, when we remember God's faithfulness in the past, recognize His presence now, and rely on His provision moving forward.

 - 1. His Spirit
 - 2. His Gifts
